



Common Mistakes

- Stand Alone Bins
- Unmonitored Debris/Zero Waste Stations
- No or Poor Placement of Signs





Monitoring Diversion Rates

- We expect events to reach a 50% diversion rate
- Composting is essential in order to reach a 50% diversion rate
- Diversion numbers available from Recology
- Visit Events
- Submit diversion rates to DPT and other permitting agencies
- Low diversion rates may effect permits not being renewed in the future
